Principal's Report

Swimming Sports

Thanks also to Parents' Club for running a successful BBQ and stall which was greatly appreciated. On Tuesday night we held our annual Year 7 Welcome BBQ. VCE/VCAL Information Evening

On Wednesday night, the now annual VCE/VCAL Information Evening was conducted at the College. This night is intended to give students and parents an overview of the requirements and administration of either the VCE or VCAL course. Students and parents then got to hear and meet each of the relevant subject teachers who provided an outline and overview of their particular subjects. This year, the VCE students were fortunate to have a guest speaker - Chloe Frank - who was the 2020 School Captain and Dux of Donald High School, who gained an ATAR score of 96.3. Chloe shared some of her immediate experience and advice, providing some excellent study tips and techniques that could and will be very useful for our students. Chloe was able to provide first-hand experience of what it took to gain a score in the high 90's and we thank her for being willing to come down and share both her story and some of her work samples with our students.

Bus Travellers

A reminder to all bus travellers that they must notify the Assistant Principal or General Office if they are not going to be travelling on the bus, especially in the afternoons. We have already had a number of occasions where the buses have been held up, waiting to see if students will turn up or not. We are very fortunate to have access to free bus travel and this is a privilege, not a right. If students or families regularly fail to inform the College of absences from the bus, access to buses may be denied.

Student Behaviour and food intake

As can happen at the start of the year, and especially considering the year that 2020 was, we are noticing some poor behaviour choices from some students. While we are dealing with these issues at a school level, your support at home is greatly appreciated. One thing that has come to our attention is a number of students arriving at school having consumed, or consuming so called "Energy Drinks". This is of great concern not only for the short term effects on heart rate and behaviour, but also the long term effects on developing bodies. Breakfast is clearly recognised as one of the most important meals of the day and should be a healthy one. Could we please request that students are not provided with energy drinks before or during the school day.

On Monday, 15th February we will be conducting our Student Leaders Ceremony in conjunction with the Primary School at the Town Hall providing COVID restrictions do not change between now and then. Parents are invited to come and watch the presentation which will begin at 2pm and conclude by 2:45pm so bus travellers can walk to the Primary School for pick up. Due to COVID, there will be no afternoon tea served this year.



26 Year Old Swimming Record Broken at the St. Arnaud

Secondary College Swimming Sports



In 1995 Andrew McSwain competed in the 20 Yrs 50m Breast-stroke and set a record time of 43.89 secs. This record has stood for 26 years until this year with Year 12 student Riley Burke breaking the record in a time of 40.25 sec. Riley may also set a record for the length of time this record stands until it is broken.

Jesse Amos also had a quick day in the pool, breaking two records for the day. Jesse competed in the 20 Yrs 50m Butterfly and swam a time of 32.16 sec, breaking the 2019 time set by Riley Burke 33.07 sec. Also swimming in the 16 Yrs 50m Backstroke, Jesse swam a time of 36.28 sec, breaking the 2019 Riley Burke record of 37.75 sec. Lara Small competed in 13 Yrs 25m Freestyle, swimming a time of 20.22 sec and recorded a new record which was previously held by Tiffanny Bussem Jorgensen in 2014 with a time of 20.28 sec.

Parent Payments and School Charges 2021

St. Arnaud Secondary College Council is committed to providing the best possible learning opportunities for all our students. In order to support our students and parents throughout the year, the College makes available to all students many items and services that are generally funded by parents. The College has introduced a textbook hire scheme, which will financially assist families.

Parent Payment Arrangements and Options:

- Parents will be provided with early notification of annual payment requests and reasonable notice will be given for any other payment requests during the year (i.e. excursions, camps)
- The College offers Parents the option to make payment by instalments. Please contact Kerrie Swanton, Business Manager, to make these arrangements.
- Methods of payment are BPAY, cash or cheque.
- Eligible families that receive Camps, Sport & Excursion Funds can allocate these funds for sports travel, camps and excursions only.
- The payment for Optional Items including camps and excursions must be paid by the specified due date prior to departure. Other payments for Optional Items including Food Technology must be paid in week 2 of each Term, or by negotiated instalments.
