#### Yr. 12 Food Studies






Term 1 Week 9; the Year 12 Food Studies cooked chicken, lemon and pea risotto, and berry muffins for dessert. The students also looked at the difference in making fresh vegetable rice and pre-packaged vegetable rice, and taste tested lunchbox muffins. These all form the topic of healthy eating for children which we are covering in the theory classes. The idea of the vegetable rice is to replace a serve of carbs (rice) with a serve of vegetables (Cauliflower/Broccoli Rice). How do we encourage children to choose healthy options? Do we encourage them to help with shopping, preparation and cooking? Research states that it takes 15 repetitions before a child is willing to try and accept a new food.







# Yr. 7/8 Science



In Science this week, the students started looking at separating mixtures. The students undertook three practical investigations, the first being how to filter water. This was related back to a simple version of how a fuel filter or oil filter work to remove unwanted particles. The second investigation was separating colour; photos attached. The third investigation was to create a water still, if stuck in the bush or outback, and how to collect water.

Instrumental lessons are free at our college and places are filling up fast. Get your permission forms in quick to secure your place in 2023's music program!



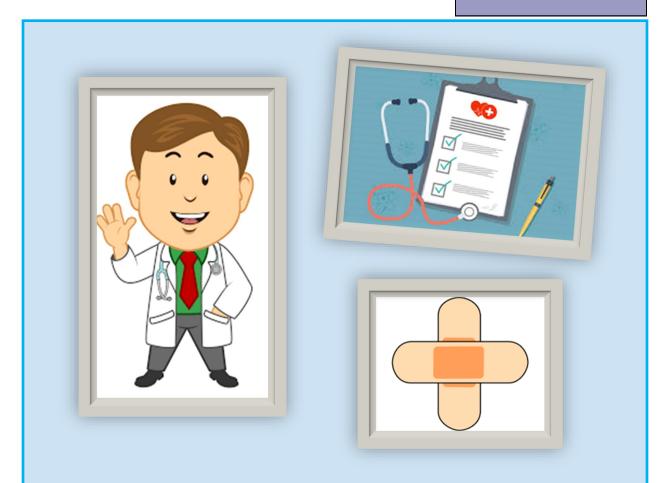





#### E-CIGARETTES & VAPING

WHAT WE NEED TO KNOW

While most people do not use e-cigarettes (also known as vapes), the number of young people who are using them (vaping) is increasing, and that's a concern for the health of our communities.

- · There are no quality or safety standards for e-cigarettes so they could be made anywhere, by anyone and contain anything.
- Many vapes contain addictive nicotine, even the ones that say they don't. They just don't put it on the pack.
- · Vapes contain the same toxic chemicals found in cleaning products, nail polish remover, weed killer and bug spray. These chemicals do not belong in our lungs.

#### E-cigarettes / vaping and the law

- · Smoking and vaping are banned in the grounds of, and within 4 metres of entrances to: childcare centres, kinders and schools.
- · In Victoria it is illegal to sell e-cigarette devices or e-cigarette accessories containing nicotine.
- · It is also illegal to sell e-cigarettes to, or buy e-cigarettes for, any person aged under 18 years.


