


Interhouse Cross Country

In the last week of Term 1, the Year 12 Biology students travelled once again to Ecolinc to complete some School Assessed Coursework. They



investigated photosynthetic rates in chloroplasts under different light conditions and practiced using scientific methodologies to design their own experiment.

They were able to explain leaf gas exchange using different variables such as temperature and carbon dioxide concentration.

St. Arnaud Secondary College's new music room is set up and ready to go! Instruments are on the racks, guitars are plugged into their amps and drums sets are ready to roll.



To apply for the Aspire Community Contribution program, students need to write two 100-word statements explaining their involvement and impact. Examples of Aspire students' contributions include:




