Principal's Report

Year 9 to 11 Exams

This week, students in Years 9, 10 and 11 have been undertaking exams in all their subjects. These exams will count towards their end of semester assessment, but more importantly, are an



opportunity to practice preparing and undertaking an exam which they will have to do in later years of schooling, and most probably, if they continue into further education. Good exam preparation is a skill that can be taught and learnt, and I encourage all students to reflect on what they did well and what they could do better in preparation for each of their exams next semester.

Year 12 GAT

Next Thursday (15th June), all students undertaking a Year 12 subject are required to undertake the General Achievement Test. This year is the first year that students undertaking the old VCAL certificate (this is the final year) or the new VCE Vocational Major will also have to undertake the test. This year the test is in two parts. The first, which all students undertake, focuses on basic literacy and numeracy skills. The second part, which is only undertaken by VCE students, focuses more on general knowledge. These tests are very important for all students – for VCAL or VM students it can determine overall pass or fail of the certificate - and for VCE students, can help influence their final scores.

LMR Cross Country

On Tuesday, we hosted schools from east of Bendigo to the west of Mildura for the Loddon Mallee Region Zone Cross Country at Lord Nelson Park. In what many could possibly describe as perfect Cross Country weather conditions (cool and misty rain), our competitors took to the track and gave it their all. Our Under 16 girls' team of Abby Weir, Ada Buenaventura and Sophie O'Donnell, came in second place, just missing out on an invitation to the State competition – a fantastic effort. Thanks to Mr. Knight for his organisation of the entire event and to Mr. Mac, Miss. G and Mr. Cornwell for helping as well. We had some Year 8 students helping on checkpoints who also did a great job on the day. Thanks also to Stacey Wandel and to Kim Birthisel and everyone else who was able to help in the canteen. This is an important event for us in terms of fundraising, especially for 'out of town' money – so thanks again to everyone for your help and support.


Victorian Government Schools Principal's Conference



Yr. 12 Food Studies



In Week 6 Term 2, the students were cooking for a SAC (School Assessed Coursework). Each student chose between three possible lists of ingredients, to cook a meal for a male, female or child. The ingredients provided were meat and vegetables, with one also including pasta. It was then up to the student to produce a healthy meal. They could use anything from the pantry for flavouring. The students were also required to cook everything on their own, with no assistance with preparation, cooking or cleaning up afterwards. After the meal was created and eaten, they were required to look at the healthy eating guide to assess if it adequately met the requirements. This finishes off Unit 3 practical assessment; the theory has also been completed.



Yr. 10 Personal Development Class











E-CIGARETTES & VAPING

WHAT WE NEED TO KNOW

While most people do not use e-cigarettes (also known as vapes), the number of young people who are using them (vaping) is increasing, and that's a concern for the health of our communities.

- There are no quality or safety standards for e-cigarettes so they could be made anywhere, by anyone and contain anything.
- Many vapes contain addictive nicotine, even the ones that say they don't. They just don't put it on the pack.
- · Vapes contain the same toxic chemicals found in cleaning products, nail polish remover, weed killer and bug spray. These chemicals do not belong in our lungs.

E-cigarettes / vaping and the law

- · Smoking and vaping are banned in the grounds of, and within 4 metres of entrances to: childcare centres, kinders and schools.
- In Victoria it is illegal to sell e-cigarette devices or e-cigarette accessories containing nicotine.
- · It is also illegal to sell e-cigarettes to, or buy e-cigarettes for, any person aged under 18 years.




