Principal's report

<u>Tuesday 14 June – Professional Practice Day</u>

Just a reminder to all students and parents that next Monday is the Queen's Birthday Public Holiday and next Tuesday 14 June is a Professional Practice day for all staff. Staff will be using this day to finish reports and begin the proofreading process. This means



that no students are expected at school on either day at the start of next week. I hope that everyone can have a bit of a break while staff are finalising assessment and writing reports.

Semester 2 begins Wednesday 15 June

Semester 2 subjects begin next Wednesday following the long weekend and Professional Practice day. This means that students in Years 7 to 10 will have changes to their timetables and may have some new classes. The new timetable should be up on Compass prior to next Tuesday

Year 9-11 exams

Students in Years 9, 10 and 11 have undertaken mid-year exams this week. These exams are used for a variety of purposes including one way of assessing what students have learnt over the semester. They are however, and more importantly, used as a good practice for students as they move through their schooling. We all know that exams form a major part of assessment in VCE and with the changes to VCAL coming into effect next year, it is envisaged that some of the assessment of students undertaking a vocational pathway will include exam type testing. I encourage all students to take the time to read over their exams and identify areas that they need to concentrate on. I also strongly encourage students to think about how they prepared for their exams and what they could do differently in their preparation to help them achieve a better result next time. This is the basic rationale behind beginning exams at Year 9.

Final day of the Review

Today was the final day for our four year Review and I would like to thank everyone, including the parents who came in for this morning's Parent Forum, for their input into the Pre-Review Self Evaluation and the review process itself. This has been a significant body of work for the College and it is very clear to all concerned that the college has made some significant improvements over the past four years.

This morning during period 1, students in Years 10, 11 and 12 attended a presentation from the Australian Defence Forces. The presentation covered the wide range of opportunities there are within the defence forces and possible pathways for students, including scholarships and incentives.

Phones at School



<u>Year 9 - Try a VET day - Friday 17th June</u>

Next week the Year 9 students will be heading over to the North Central Trade Trading Centre to check out the range of VET (Vocational Education Training) Courses that they have on offer. If your child is looking to undertake an apprenticeship when they complete school this can lead them into that and get them ahead of others.

VET allows students to include vocational studies within their secondary schools' certificate. Students undertaking VET receive Nationally recognised training from either a national training package or accredited state curriculum which may contribute to their Certificates.

Benefits of VET:

Students may receive an enhanced Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) score which can improve access to further education, pathways to employment or further VET education. Workplace experience is enhanced by access to Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) and possible access to School Based Apprenticeships and Traineeships (SBAT's).



Mathematics and Science Competitions

Australians spend an average of 1 hour and 57 minutes on social media every day.

Although social media can be a powerful tool for connection and a sense of community, it also poses significant risks to mental health and wellbeing, especially for teens and young adults.

The culture of comparison and the reliance on positive feedback often cultivated by social media, can have detrimental effects on self-esteem, body image and self-confidence.


Studies show that social media activates the reward pathways in our brain. The receival of notifications stimulates dopamine release, which promotes addictive behaviours, and we often find ourselves losing track of time as we scroll on our screens.

When we have this increased reliance on social media, the negative aspects of it can become increasingly more impactful. Constantly comparing ourselves to the people we see online promotes self-criticism and time spent on our screens takes away from doing things which protect our mental wellbeing such as spending time with friends, being in nature or exercising.

Be conscious of your social media usage and regulate your screen time. By setting boundaries to protect our mental health we can utilise social media for its many benefits while still maintaining a healthy and balanced lifestyle.

Keep an eye out for our progress as our entire school takes on this challenge.

PARENT / CAREGIVER / GUARDIAN INFORMATION AND CONSENT LETTER 2022 Student Attitudes to School Survey

Dear Parent / Caregiver / Guardian,

This letter is to inform you about the 2022 Student Attitudes to School Survey (AtoSS), that your child is invited to participate in.

About the survey

We value student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction and are conducting a survey to find out what your child thinks of your school.

The AtoSS is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education and Training to assist your child's school to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Students will be asked about their thoughts and feelings in relation to their school, their learning, peer and family relationships, resilience, bullying, mental health and wellbeing, physical activity, and life in general.

This year, the AtoSS will be conducted at your school over the period 15th June - 17th June.

What are the benefits?

In our experience, young people enjoy having their say. We have been running this survey for nearly 20 years and it has been invaluable in helping schools understand student views. Your school will use the survey results to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience.

What are the risks?

While we do not anticipate many risks of participation, some students may find some of the survey questions too personal and sensitive in nature. Should you agree for your child to participate, they are still free to skip questions or to withdraw at any stage if the survey makes them upset or uncomfortable.

The survey has been approved by a Human Research Ethics Committee. The questions are selected from validated survey instruments used in Australia and around the world, are strength-based, and tailored for each year level group.

What will my child be asked to do?

Your child will be invited to complete the survey online during class time using a purpose built secure online survey tool. It is important to note that we are not in any way "testing" your child. Please note:

- Student participation in the survey is voluntary and students may withdraw at any time.
- The survey will take around 20-45 minutes to complete.

How is my child's confidentiality protected?

Your child will be provided with a unique login to complete the survey from their teacher. The student login is an assigned identifier that may be used to link data for statistical and research purposes only. Personally identifiable data will not be recorded in the survey response file. This ensures that the confidentiality of your child's responses is protected at all times.

How will results be reported?

The survey results will be reported back to the school in an aggregate form throughout the survey period. All survey data that is made available in reports are for groups of students only so that no

individual student can be identified. Data suppression rules are used for schools with low student numbers per year level.

Your school may share the results of the survey with parents, in documents such as the School Annual Report.

Options for participation

Participation in this survey is **voluntary**. If you **do not** wish for your child to do the survey, please opt out via email to your school: st.arnaud.sc@education.vic.gov.au. Please do so before Wednesday 15th June, stating that you wish to opt out of your child's participation, along with their name and year level.

If your school does not receive a Refusal of Consent email from yourself before the survey commencement date mentioned within this letter, it means that you give your consent for your child to participate in the 2022 Attitudes to School Survey.

A copy of the survey that we are asking your child to complete is available from your child's school. Please contact the administration office if you would like to see the survey before making your decision about whether you would like your child to participate.

The Department of Education and Training has sought to clarify the Parent Payments Policy for 2022. Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories.

- Curriculum Contributions contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum e.g., textbook use, consumable materials, paper
- Other Contributions Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives e.g., school building enhancements
- Extra-Curricular Items and Activities Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis. e.g., Optional Year level camps

- The payment for Optional Items including camps and excursions must be paid by the specified due date prior to departure. Other payments for Optional Items including Food Technology must be paid in week 2 of each Term, or by negotiated instalments.
- When making payment via BPAY, please note the receipt number on the returned permission slip or email paid items to <u>st.arnaud.sc@education.vic.gov.au</u>
- New families to the school who do not have Family BPay details, please contact the school for these details.

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps, and sporting activities. Applications for the Camps, Sports, and Excursions Fund (CSEF) close 24/06/2022

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card, or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible.

Payment amounts this year are \$225 for eligible secondary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.







COVID UPDATE - RATs TERM 2

RATs will continue to be distributed to you as they have been throughout this school year for the remainder of this term.

However, from Monday 23 May 2022, students will no longer be recommended to undertake either twice weekly RATs in mainstream schools or 5 days a week in specialist schools.

RATs however will continue to be required by students who are household contacts to attend school (5 negative tests over a 7-day period) or who have symptoms.

The ongoing supply of RATs to families in our school will ensure that parents and carers will have them should they need them if their child is a household contact or has symptoms.

Families must continue to notify the Department of Health and the school if their child returns a positive RAT result. Additionally, you should inform us if any of your children are household contacts.

Thank you also to all families who has got their child vaccinated. Vaccination continues to remain the best way to protect students and staff in our school.

Getting vaccinated is easy and bookings can be done via the <u>coronavirus website</u>. If you have any questions about the vaccines, I encourage you to speak to your GP or a health practitioner.




