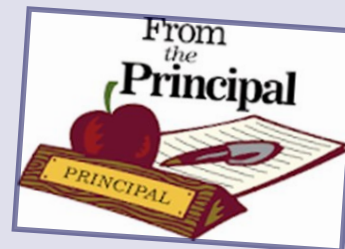

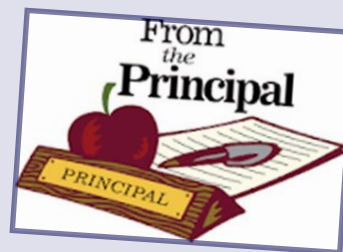
Year 9 to 11 Exams

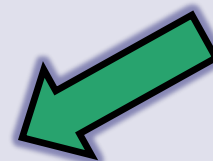
Building Update



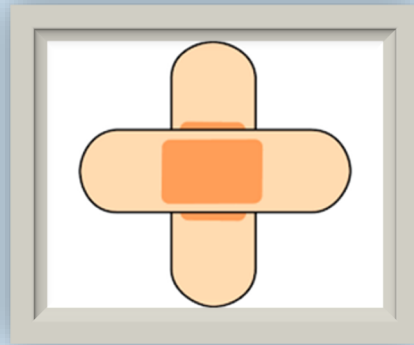
Both teams will have 8 riders and 1 pit crew member, with an even split of males and females.

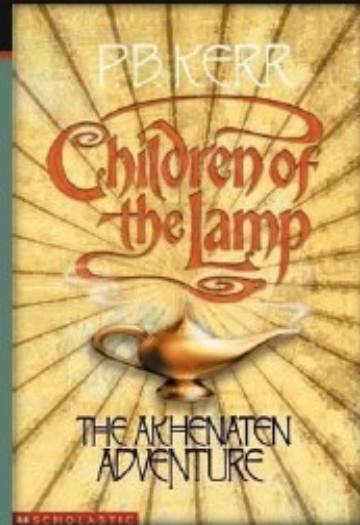

John and Philippa Gaunt are twins. Ordinary human children, they believe. But when their parents' housekeeper wins the lottery, they make an extraordinary discovery. . .

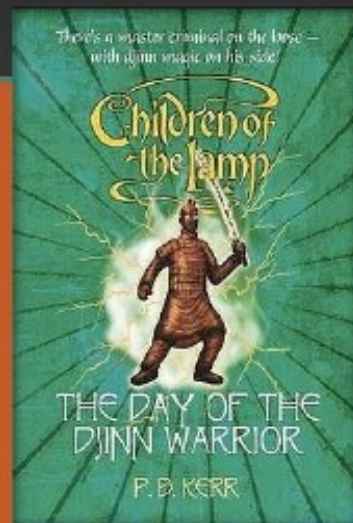

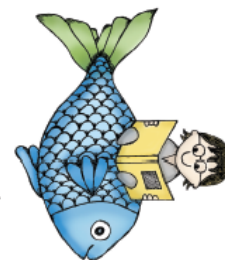
