



Principal's Report

2023 VCE Results

As announced earlier this week, Jesse Amos is the Dux of the College with an ATAR score of 89. Jesse topped the College in Outdoor Education, Chemistry, Geography and History, and equal top in English. Of a particular note, Jesse's Chemistry score of 41.08 puts him in the top 9% of students of Chemistry in the



state. His score of 89 makes Jesse the second highest ATAR at the College for more than 10 years. Just behind Jesse with a score of 88 (and our third highest ATAR in 10 years) was Izzy Hand. Izzy was equal top in English and topped the school in Maths Methods, French, Biology and Extended Investigation where she scored a 42.07 putting her in the top 8% of EI students in the state. Our students achieved an average ATAR of 66.04 which is also the highest in 10 years, which is a wonderful achievement. More importantly than that, all 8 students studying scored VCE, have achieved results that will enable them access to their first preference of course which is outstanding. Four of these students have already received early offers. Well done to Jesse, and to all our Year 12 students.

Year 7 – 9 2023 Activities Week

I would like to thank and congratulate all the Year 7 to 9 students who have turned up to school every day this week. By all reports they have had a good week and enjoyed the activities on offer, and the chance to catch up with their friends outside of normal classes. The day trip to the Adventure Park has been very popular in the past and hopefully the weather is better than last year! There are, however, several students who did not attend activities week and will therefore be starting the year with up to 5 days absence in Semester 1, 2024. As has been clearly articulated, Step Up and activities week are a part of the school program and attendance is mandatory. As parents, we need to be supporting our children to make positive choices, and attendance at school should be very high on all agendas. We need to be careful that we don't enable an "opt out" culture, as there will always be times in our lives that we must do things that are either expected or required of us.





2024 Parent Payments Policy

School Council has approved the Curriculum Contributions, Other Contributions, and Extra-Curricular Items and Activities for 2024.

Parent Payment Arrangements and Options:

- Parents will be provided with early notification of annual payment requests and reasonable notice will be given for any other payment requests during the year (i.e. excursions, camps)
- The College offers Parents the option to make payment by instalments. Please contact Kerrie Swanton, Business Manager, to make these arrangements.
- Methods of payment are BPAY, EFTPOS, cash or cheque.
- Eligible families that receive Camps, Sport & Excursion Funds can allocate these funds for sports travel, camps and excursions only.
- The payment for Extra-Curricular Items and Activities, including camps and excursions must be paid by the specified due date prior to departure.
- When making payment via BPAY please note the receipt number on the returned permission slip or email paid items to st.arnaud.sc@education.vic.gov.au
- New families to the school who do not have Family BPay details, please contact the school for these details.

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. Applications for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) close 28th June 2024.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible.

Payment amounts this year are \$225 for eligible secondary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office on 5495 1811 and ask for an application form.

PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access
 to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the
 requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the
 Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the
 Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for noncurriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

 Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot
 pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.



St Arnaud Secondary College Bring Your Own Device Program (BYOD) 2024

Students studying at St Arnaud Secondary College in 2024 are invited to supply their own notebook device for use as part of the College's BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) program. This document provides details of the BYOD program and device recommendations. For further details see the College's website – BYOD Program 2024 https://www.starnaudsc.vic.edu.au/

What type of BYOD do students need?

The device must be capable of connecting to the College's 5GHz Wi-Fi network, so it must support 802.11a or 802.11ac Wi-Fi connections. The device should be appropriate to work on and produce office style documents such as spreadsheets, word processed documents and presentations which may need to be printed or submitted electronically.

A table of recommended device specifications can be found in the BYOD Recommendations Guide. Ideally students should obtain a BYOD device which meets with the specification in the "Great" or "Acceptable" section of the table. The table is intended as a guide, where devices with some variation from the specifications listed may be suitable.

Do participating students require a new device?

Participating students are not required to purchase a new device. Students may already have a device that will be suitable. Use the BYOD Recommendations Guide to compare the device's suitability.

If students do prefer to use a new device, where should they purchase it from?

You are not required to purchase a device from any particular supplier. However, to assist you with the choice of device, you can purchase from Learning with Technology (LWT), and a link is provided for you to view the devices listed on the LWT portal for comparison of device offerings from other suppliers also.

What software can the College provide me for my BYOD at no cost?

St. Arnaud Secondary College can provide access to Microsoft Office, which includes Word, Excel, PowerPoint, OneNote and Outlook, and to Adobe Creative Cloud software titles for the duration of a student's enrolment at the College.

Repairs, Warranty and Theft

The College insurance does not cover students' personal devices. When purchasing a new device, it is highly recommended that an extended warranty and insurance is purchased. The College is not responsible for any repairs, maintenance or theft of the BYOD device.

Care of Device

It is recommended that students purchase a carry bag or cover, as most repairs to notebook devices are caused by droppage or spillages.

SUPPORT YOUR CHILD'S EDUCATION WITH 12 MONTHS FREE INTERNET AT HOME

The Australian Government has established the School Student Broadband Initiative to provide free home internet for up to 30,000 eligible families with school-aged students:

- The period in which a family can apply to receive a free service is up to 31 December 2024
- . The duration of free services will continue until 31 December 2025 for all existing and new families

The initiative aims to boost education opportunities. NBN Co is leading the rollout of this initiative across the country.

How the School Student Broadband Initiative can help your child

Children who can access online learning at home as part of their education are more likely to engage in classroom activities.

Access to fast internet at home can also support children to build their digital skills, learn how to safely use the internet and take part in a world that is more reliant on digital technology.

Eligibility

To be eligible, families must:

- · have a child living at home enrolled in an Australian school
- not have an active National Broadband Network (nbn) internet service at their home (having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility)
- live in a premises that can access the National Broadband Network through a standard connection. NBN Co will check this for you after you apply
- Not have had an active nbn connection during the previous 14 days*
- register interest with your school and complete a consent form to be assessed for eligibility.
- There may be cases where exceptions can be made, once you have had your address checked, please contact the School Student Broadband Initiative team at SSBI@education.vic.gov.au to discuss further.

How the School Student Broadband Initiative works

If you are eligible, your home internet service will be provided at no cost through until the end of 2025, with a participating internet provider on the National Broadband Network. Each internet provider has its own process to get you connected, which may involve you providing identification.

Once you sign up, the internet provider will help you set up your connection. The initiative does not include devices such as a computer or tablet. Other members of your household can use the internet service provided through this initiative.

The period of free internet will start from the day your service is activated with your chosen provider. At the end of the free broadband period, you will not be placed onto a paid service by your internet provider without your consent. The Australian Government is considering options beyond the free period.

How to apply

- Ask your school for a copy of the School Student Broadband Initiative consent form.
- Complete the consent form and return to the school.
- . NBN Co will use student address details on the consent form to confirm eligibility.
- If you are eligible, NBN Co will issue a voucher for your family to use to sign up with a participating internet
 provider. This will be provided to you by your school. <u>Please note</u>: NBN Co will review the home address for
 eligibility. No personal information other than your main home address will be shared with NBN Co. Please
 see the consent form for details about how personal information will be used.

Have you experienced property damage, trauma, or loss as a result of the 2022 Victorian floods?

The Recovery Support Program can provide support for people who have been affected by the 2022 Victorian floods.

Recovery Support Workers are a single point of contact for those who need it. Support provided by them may include:

- A discussion about your needs and what next steps might be appropriate.
- Referrals to external agencies for mental health and wellbeing needs.
- Information and resources to connect you to local services to assist in the recovery process.
- Advocacy and assistance with completing applications/paperwork required for financial or insurance claim processes and grants.
- Assistance with access to available material support options.
- Advocate on your behalf regarding recovery challenges.
- Outreach visits by an allocated Recovery Support Worker if this is helpful to your situation.

The Recovery Support service may be able to provide you with a small amount of financial support to respond to immediate financial need.

Who's it for?

Individuals and families who live in Victoria who were impacted by the 2022 flood events.

Cost

There is no charge for the support provided by this program that is funded by the Commonwealth - State Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA) and the Victorian Government.
